

## CONFIDENTIAL REPORTING

Central Arizona College allows for confidential reporting of crime. Victims who do not want to pursue action within the College or the criminal justice system can make a confidential report on any crime. CAC Police Department and Security Officers can file a report of the incident without revealing the identity of the victim. Various counseling outside resources are available through the College.

The purpose of such a report is to comply with the victim's wishes to keep the matter confidential, while taking steps to ensure the future safety of the victim and others. With this information, the College can keep and disseminate accurate records of the number of incidents involving students, determine where there is a pattern of crime with regard to a particular location, method, or assailant, and alert the community to potential danger.

Reports filed on any crime, in this manner, are counted and disclosed in the annual crime statistics for the College. ### **Sample of Campus Security Authorities – CSA's responsible for reporting criminal activity include:**

- Professional staff in a dean of students office, including leaders in student affairs and housing
- Staff in the student lounge or student union building
- Faculty or staff advisors to student organizations
- Resident assistants/advisors; Residence Life Directors/Professional Staff
- Athletic directors (ADs) and coaches (including assistant ADs and assistant coaches)
- Campus Police and contract security officers
- Event security staff
- Administrators at all campuses
- Title IX staff and investigators
