Pre-Program Admission Requirements:

Before applying to the program, students need to have completed the following:

BIO181 General Biology I , BIO156 or placement assessment required to register for BIO201 or BIO205.
Completion of BIO201 and BIO202 with a grade of "C" or better (within 5 years prior to the application or if older a score of 67% or better on the NLN A&P exam).
LPN License from the Arizona State Board of Nursing must be included in the application to the CAC Nursing program.
Application to the Nursing Program (Must attend an informational session within one year of application.) The program application will be provided in the information session.
NLN NACE exam at CAC prior to submitting application. The NACE exam must be completed within 3 attempts with a qualifying score of 67% or better.
Cumulative GPA of 2.75 or higher.
Students must be able to meet the Essential Functions of the Nursing Program as listed on the Nursing Functional Abilities Form.
Concurrent Enrollment Programs (CEP) are available for those who wish to consider obtaining their Baccalaureate Degree by taking classes along with AAS courses. Please attend an information session for more information at Nursing (AAS) - Central Arizona College (centralaz.edu) .
