




Distribution of Pinal County Property Tax Revenue 2014-15



General Tuition per Credit Hour - AZ Resident






Increasing Revenue



Primary Tax Rate FY 94-95 through FY 14-15







Economic Impact Study Highlights

For every \$1.00 spent:

- Taxpayers see a return of \$1.30 (in the form of higher tax receipts and avoided costs)
- State and local governments see an annual rate of return of \$6.90
- Students gain \$6.00 in lifetime income
