HRM certificate courses stack in to the HRM, Culinary Arts or Business A.A.S. Degrees

- The HRM Certificate with 18 credits (6 classes) can be completed online in one year.
- The HRM certificate is a great additional job endorsement for Culinary Arts or Business majors by increasing employability into management positions.
- These courses can then be applied toward or stack into the Associates of Applied Science or A.A.S. in Hotel & Restaurant Management, Culinary Arts or the Business A.A.S. degrees with 65-66 credits.
- The HRM A.A.S. Degree contains all A.A. Degree AGEC course requirements for transferability.
- Each hospitality or HRM course utilizes the national American Hotel & Lodging Association Educational Institute curriculum. Students may additionally receive a nationally recognized and industry standardized AHLA certificate upon each course completion with a 70% final exam competency.
