CAREER INFORMATION

English majors have enormous career options available to them. Traditional fields include writing and editing for online and print media and publishing firms as well as teaching at the elementary and secondary school levels. Nearly, 30 percent of English graduates work in the education sector after acquiring a teaching certificate or an advanced degree.

Specific jobs can include contract and grant writing or editing, technical writing, copy editing, journalism, broadcasting, sales and marketing, public relations, management training and administration, office management, insurance, and real-estate. Increasingly, one of the fastest career choices for English majors is “business” because the verbal and written communication skills that English majors possess, along with their strong analytical skills, remain in top demand at nearly every company. Similarly, English majors may also seek advanced degrees in law, library science, and even medicine as well as academic research posts at colleges and universities.
