

ARIZONA GENERAL EDUCATION CURRICULUM (AGEC)

Course List for 2020-2021

- Completion of the AGECE will fulfill lower division general education requirements and will be fully applicable to the baccalaureate degree upon transfer to an Arizona public university. Three tracks are available: AGECE-Arts, AGECE-Business, and AGECE-Science. All require completion of 35-37 transferable credits-exception for transferred Written Composition of ENG 105 from NAU, ENG 105 from ASU, and ENG 109H from UA.
- Students are encouraged to meet with an advisor to select courses to meet the AGECE requirements that will also fulfill program requirements in the college and major they intend to pursue upon transfer.

AGECE (35-38 Credits): Arizona General Education Curriculum (AGECE)

When fulfilling the AGECE requirements, students may count only one course in each of these categories without duplication: Written Communications, Oral Communications, Arts & Humanities, Social/Behavioral Sciences, Biological/Physical Sciences, and Mathematics. *A course may be used to satisfy more than one Special Awareness Requirement (IW, CU, GI, HI-see abbreviation key below)*

Courses that are Highlighted can be taken with RDG 100 as a Co-Requisite. The other courses require RDG 100 as a Prerequisite.
